Thank you all for the support and encouragement that you have shown to me since 2000 when I was first elected to the Pennsylvania State Board. I hope that I fulfill your expectations as State Regent.

It has been a busy time since our State Convention in May. My husband thought that I had a phone growing out of my ear, so he bought me a headset, so I could accomplish other tasks while trying to find District Deputies for our Courts. District Deputies (DD) are important supervisors in our state since we are so large. Expect a phone call from your DD every four to six weeks. If we make the relationship between the DD and Regent stronger, we will make our Courts stronger. Fortunately, many wonderful members have agreed to supervise our Courts for the next two years. Become friends with your DD. She is there to help your Court walk on the "CDA path."

As you can see, your State Newsletter came to you via email. We will be taking a survey in January to see if this works for you. Courts that have no officers with email, will still receive the State Newsletter by regular mail. If you have not been receiving emails from me, either I have an incorrect address or no address at all for you. Please notify me if you have recently obtained an email address. Thank you.

I have spoken to many Regents and members across the state since June. Most Courts are suffering from the same issues. Strong Membership Drives are needed to keep our Courts alive and active. Please, don't wait until your Court is down to 15 members (average age 85) to try to build your membership. If you need help, contact the Diocesan Membership Chairman (if you are lucky enough to have one) or the State Membership Chairman, Janet Oesterling (contact information is on page seven) for their assistance. We are seeing younger (40-60) women joining our CDA Courts. Now is the time to pray to our Blessed Mother for her help in recruiting new members.

I encourage you to forward this newsletter, to all your members and chaplains, who have email.

Please contact me or any of the State Officers if you have a question or need help. We are here to serve you. My prayer is that we will enjoy life, love one another, and live in *"Unity and Charity"*.

FROM THE OFFICE OF REV. D. TIMOTHY GRIMME, STATE CLERGY CONSULTANT

Congratulations to our new State Officers!

State Regent, Margaret Novak, asked me to be State Clergy Consultant and then assigned me the task of writing an article for the State Newsletter. So let me introduce myself. I am Fr. D. Timothy Grimme, pastor of St. Therese of the Child Jesus Parish in Altoona, Pennsylvania. I am not new to the Catholic Daughters of the Americas. I have been associated with Courts in the Altoona-Johnstown Diocese notably: Court St. Veronica in Renovo; Court Rev. Patrick McArdle in Bellefonte; and, presently Court Prince Gallitzin in Altoona.

My earlier associations were with long established Courts. My tasks as their chaplain was to encourage ongoing membership development and stir enthusiasm for Court programs and projects. Now I am chaplain of a newly formed Court which celebrated its second anniversary in August.

To my former tasks of membership development and enthusiasm for programs and projects, I add the task of helping the membership realize that they are part of a larger organization of woman based on *Unity and Charity*. As State Clergy Consultant, I am hoping that this will be easier.

Another difference, both former chaplaincies were to Courts that consisted mostly of members of a single parish. Thus the Court was visible to the parish and fed the vitality of the parish. My present chaplaincy is to a Court that draws membership from many parishes. This adds new dynamics to both attracting membership and to the type of programs and projects that reach across parish lines.

As State Clergy Consultant, I encourage Court Chaplains to be active in their Courts — encouraging,

complimenting, and promoting the activity of these Catholic women. As spiritual directors of their Courts, I ask that you remind them of their Christian values that they are to live and reflect and of adherence to Church directives and practices. I encourage every Court to support and encourage their chaplains, as I know they already do.

This past August we celebrated the Feast of the Assumption of Mary. Mary is honored by God for her cooperation with God's plan in the Incarnation, bringing Christ into the world. Catholic Daughters, like Mary, cooperate in the plan of God and are to bring Christ into our world through acts of *Unity and Charity*. May God bring our efforts to completion according to His divine will.

Follow the instructions in the packet you received at the State Convention, on how to have a successful Membership Drive. If you did not receive your packet, please contact me at 814-355-7730. I will be happy to send it to you.

Have at least three members on your Local Court Membership Team.

Ask permission from your Priest to give a two-minute talk after all Masses.

Set a date for your Membership Drive, making sure that it is ok with your Priest. Place announcements in the bulletin.

Expand your Court. Volunteer to be a Mother Court, by contacting other parishes in your area, to start a Court in their parish. If your Court is interested in being a Mother Court, please contact your Diocesan Membership Team for help. You may also contact me via email at oest43@verizon.net, or call 814-355-7730.
