50th Biennial State Convention

The Penn Stater Conference Center, State College April 26 - 29, 2013

Tell, our 50th State Convention is now over. We hope that everyone learned something new about CDA and enjoyed meeting old friends and making new ones. We are very happy to report that 50 out of our 79 courts were represented, with 157 people registered for the convention. We had 127 delegates and 22 alternates or members, plus our State Board, attending.

During our business sessions, the following were elected as our new State Officers: State Regent Peggy Guckin, 1st Vice State Regent Peg Rafferty, 2nd Vice State Regent Shirley Hall, State Secretary Margaret T. Giordano and State Treasurer Lisa McCann. The 2015 Nominating Committee is chaired by Jeanette Kitch, Ct. Columbia #2, with Marge Samek, Ct. St. Rene #1868, Dolly Glowacki, Ct. Lambing #314, Janet Oesterling, Ct. Rev. Patrick McArdle #448 and Sister Mary Paul Giordano, Ct. Queen of Peace #1023 on the committee.

Saturday evening, our Outgoing State Regent, Margaret, was roasted and toasted by various members and Father Grimme.
